NU-RES Admin Updates

National Institutes of Health (NIH):

- **NOT-OD-25-054: NIH Operates Under a Continuing Resolution**
 - The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), including National Institutes of Health (NIH), operates under the American Relief Act, 2025 ([Public Law 118-84](#)) signed by President Biden on December 21, 2024. This Act (CR) continues government operations through March 14, 2025, at the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 enacted level, with no reduction.
 - Consistent with NIH practices during FYs [2006 - 2024](#), NIH Institutes and/or Centers may, at their discretion, issue non-competing research grant awards at a level below that indicated on the most recent Notice of Award. Upward adjustments to awarded levels will be considered after FY 2025 appropriations are enacted, but NIH expects institutions to monitor their expenditures carefully during this period. All legislative mandates that were in effect in FY 2024 (see [NOT-OD-24-110](#)) remain in effect under this CR, as well as the salary limitation set at Executive Level II of the Federal Pay Scale (see [NOT-OD-24-057](#)) and the Ruth L. Kirschstein National Research Service Award predoctoral and postdoctoral stipend levels and tuition/fees as described in [NOT-OD-24-104](#).

- **NOT-HS-25-006**: New AHRQ "FORMS-I" Grant Application Forms and Instructions Coming for Due Dates on or after January 25, 2025

On or before January 24, 2025, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Applications submitted for due dates on or before January 24, 2025	FORMS-H application package
On or after January 25, 2025, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Applications submitted for due dates on or after January 25, 2025• All application types (New, Resubmission, Renewal, Revision)• Applications submitted early for intended due dates on or after January 25, 2025	FORMS-I application package

NU-RES Admin Updates

National Institutes of Health (NIH):

- **NOT-OD-25-040: NIH Requires Mandatory Use of the eRA Prior Approval Module for the Submission of Prior Approval Requests for all SBIR and STTR Awards Beginning January 27, 2025.**
 - All prior approval requests must be initiated and submitted by a Signing Official (SO) for the recipient organization.
 - This new prior approval requirement will be incorporated into an upcoming edition of the NIH Grants Policy Statement, section 8.1.3 Requests for Prior Approval.
 - Prior approval request types that are available at the discretion of the IC in eRA Commons:
 - Carryover Request
 - Change of PD/PI on a Grant
 - No Cost Extension
 - DMS Request (See NOT-OD-24-176)
 - Other Request- Common types of "Other" Prior Approval requests may include the following:
 - Change in Scope or Objectives
 - Change in Key Personnel
 - Adding a new domestic or foreign subaward (See NOT-OD-24-149)

National Institutes of Health (NIH):

- **NOT-OD-24-163**: NIH's Adoption of Common Forms for Biographical Sketch and Current and Pending (Other) Support by May 25, 2025
 - NIH will **require** all applicants/recipients to link their ORCID ID into SciENcv in the Persistent Identifier (PID) section of the Common Forms.
 - NIH will **require** all applicants/recipients to link their ORCID ID to their eRA Commons Personal Profile on May 25, 2025

NU-RES Finance Updates

Uniform Guidance Updates

- Slides from December 2024 Learn More session are posted on NURES website - [2024 Uniform Guidance Revisions: Implementation](#)

All new proposals should budget using the new thresholds:

- Capital & Fabricated Equipment: current \$5,000 threshold will increase to \$10,000
- Subaward IDC recovery: overhead on the first \$25,000 of issued subawards will increase to \$50,000

When will changes be effective?

- [FY25 rate agreement dated 6/6/24](#) is currently in place
- Changes will take effect for new awards received after Northeastern University receives its next rate agreement.
- Northeastern is still in the process of negotiating the next rate agreement. We expect to have the new rate agreement in FY26 but will not be available on 7/1/25.

UG Updates – MTDC Examples

Prior version of Uniform Guidance

Modified Total Direct Cost Base:

- Includes first **\$25,000** of each subaward
- Excludes capital equipment in excess of **\$5,000**

FY25 rate agreement currently in place

New version of Uniform Guidance as of 10/1/24

Modified Total Direct Cost Base:

- Includes first **\$50,000** of each subaward
- Excludes capital equipment in excess of **\$10,000**

FY26 NU rate agreement (pending)

NU-RES Compliance Updates

- Research security training requirements mandated by the [Department of Energy \(DOE\) Financial Assistance Letter \(FAL 2025-02\)](#) and the new requirements outlined in the [Department of Energy's \(DOE\) Financial Assistance Letter \(FAL 2024-05\)](#) regarding Digital Persistent Identifiers (DPIs) or Persistent Identifiers (PIDs) for all R&D financial assistance awards.
- These requirements become mandatory beginning **May 1, 2025** for all individuals involved in DOE-funded research projects or submitting applications to the DOE. These requirements are being implemented as required by the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy.
- All research security training will be completed through Workday Learning

NU-RES Compliance Updates

- [NIH Notice NOT-OD-24-163](#): NIH will **require** all applicants/recipients to link their ORCID ID into SciENcv in the Persistent Identifier (PID) section of the Common Forms.
 - NIH will **require** all applicants/recipients to link their ORCID ID to their eRA Commons Personal Profile on May 25, 2025
